The Willis Wharf Shoreline Landscaping garden is another gorgeous and salt tolerant native plant garden located along the waterline in the town of Willis Wharf. Here you may see many types of salt tolerant natives that are different from the salt tolerant native plants that were seen in the Wachapreague Seaside Park Seaside



Garden. Those plants include, but are not limited to: Common Persimmon, Eastern Redcedar, Coral or Trumpet Honeysuckle, Northern Bayberry, and Switch Grass. This garden was found to be moderately accessible. The terrain is mostly flat but is grassy in some areas which visitors of the trail may find problematic if living with a disability that affects walking skills; No Limits especially recommends using caution after wet weather. This garden does contain an observation platform that is very accessible which overlooks the water; it is a beautiful sight! There are very few amenities nearby this garden so it is recommended to plan accordingly. If a visitor needs access to public restrooms, water, or telephones it is to be noted that there are not accessible amenities nearby.
